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
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Bloke-skier

Thus a Bloke-skier was illustrated by one of the greatest Slovenc artists Maksim Gaspari. Blok-skiing is famous because it was first mentioned already in 1689, in the first record of skiing in the central Europe. For the first time in this written text sample a ski-turn is mentioned. Bloke-skiing was demonstrated yesterday on the surface of the ski stadium by Aleš Guček.








Dear friends


Championship is open. Honorary President Joško Pirnur and multiple winner of the competition Marjeta Šožtarič were granted the honour of raising the SCIJ flag.

In remembrance of the first ski runs

At the occasion of the 46th championship Mr. Aleš Guček introduced Bloke-skiing. It is a speciality on which the Slovene folk, reputed as a nation of skiers, is especially proud.

The book »Slava Vojvudine Kranjske» (»Glory of the Carniola Duchy») by the author Janez Vajkard Valvasor contains the very first written record about skiing in the central Europe, and thus the first mentioning of a ski-turn.

Bloke-sking was probably inspired by severe winter seasons on the 600 to 870 metres high tablelands. Snow persisted there for several months, while the strong north-east winds blew large snow-

drifts. When the locals in Bluke had to go to the forest, church or valley, they helped themselves with wooden boards attached to their shoes. Nevertheless, they skied also for fun, for we know that long ago they organized their own competitions – even in ski jumping.

In the old days within the region of Bloke the locals cultivated a custom of checking up the stability of a future marriage. The bride had to step on her groom's skis and hold tight her future husband. Thus they skied together down to the winning post. If they did not fall, this was a sign that their marriage will be successful.

Aleš Guček, the former ski-runner, a representative, and later ski-instructor, was interested in the history of skiing since his early childhood. At the former high school for physical education in Ljubljana he was attracted by the research conducted by prof. Marjan Jeločník who studied the technique of Bloke-ski-turn. Janez Vajkard Valvasor, namely, does not give us any information on this technique.



Bloke-skis are a unique artefact: they are shorter than thuse known in the northern Europe, for they measure only 150 cm in length. The wooden bound (mustly from ash tree) was bent in a special procedure with the hot water. Bloke-skis have no designed edges, no channels, and bidings are made of a simple strap, sometimes manufactured from a willow tree wattle. Bloke-skier used to keep his balance with only one long stick.

In Slovenia the ethnographic museum keeps the heritage of eight pairs of Bloke-skis, among which the oldest one is 120 years old. One pair is stored also in the Ski Museum in Hollmmenkoln and another in Berlin Museum.

Jeločnik formed a demonstration group which displayed the technique of Bloke-skiing on the World INTERSKI Congress in 1979 in Japan. Today Aleš Guček remains more or less the only one who still cultivates the tradition of Bloke-skiing, and his efforts go in the direction of organizing a new group of Bloke-skiers.

Aleš Guček has 30 years

old pair of skis, the exact copy of the original. Today in the region of Bloke there are still some local people who can manufacture a perfect copy of the authentic Bloke-skis. However, today the precise knowledge of the outfit of the old-time Bloke-skiers is lost. Their skicostume was restored on the basis of a documentary shot by Metod Badjura in the years 1932 and 1932.

Spinning round on high heells



WARNING: in the evening darkness will reach also the lowlands.




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Getting started



Sea or mountain fish?

Slovenia is one of the most beautiful countries for it unites very heterogeneous country regions on a small surface. Within only a few hours of car drive one can admire infinite Pannonia plane, playful hills covered with vineyards, medium height mountains decked with dark forests, mighty Alps, the limestone of the Karst and finally the sea.

It is therefore no surprise that in Slovenia one can order delicious sea fish also on the top of a snowy ski trail. And precisely such was the unusual combina-

tion invented by our colleagues who prepared today's "Maritime Province Day" for the participants of the 46th SCIJ Meeting. Delamar cooks came from Izola, town which is the centre of sea fishing trade in our country. We, the nosy journalists have tried many times to reveal the secret of his mastery, however till now without success. This time we can proudly publish an exclusive report about his cookery and his recipes for mushroom and sour pork soup. While enumerating all the ingredients and spices Luka smiles secretly and adds that the most important thing leading to success is the right feeling - one has to cook with the heart.

EXCLUSIVELY - LUKA'S SOUPS

Mushroom soup


Ingredients:: 1/4 kg of mixed mushrooms; 1/4 kg of potatoes, chopped into cubes; 10 dkg of chopped onion; 10 dkg of smoked bacon; 2 dl of sour cream; soup vegetable (parsley, carrot, cellery, leek); spices: salt, granular pepper, laurel, thyme, garlic; for thickening: 2 table spoons of flour, 2dl of dry white wine.

Preparation: Fry the bacon, add chopped onion and fry till it turns yellow. Add shredded mush-rooms and stew for 15 minutes. Add 1,51 of water, potatoes, vegetables and salt. Wait till it starts to boil, reduce the fire and add the spices. Cook slowly until the potatoe becomes soft. Take the pot off the fire. Mix wine and water for the thickening and pour the mixture into the soup. Boil the soup once again and finally add sour cream.

Sour pork soup

Ingredients: 1 kg of swine legs, tails and ears; 15 dkg of smoked bacon; 30 dkg of potatoes, chopped into cubes; 10 dkg of chopped onion; 3 shells of garlic; parsley, yellow carrots, cellery, kohlrabi; spices: salt, pepper, thyme, laurel; 1/4 l of white dry wine; 2 dl of sour cream.

<u>Preparation:</u> Fry the bacon, add chopped onion and fry until it turns vellow. Add meat (legs, tails,

ears). Stew for approximately 10 minutes. Add COLD water and wait till it starts to boil. Reduce the fire and cook slowly. 15 minutes before the end of cooking add the potatoes, vegetables and spices. Pour the wine into the soup and cook until the meat parts from the bones. Take the pot off the fire and add sour cream. You can add a spoon or two of vinegar according to your taste.

Those who wanted to get to know Pohorje ski trails in greater detail could today take part in a tour guided by boys and girls from the Ski School Pohorje - Ski Club Branik. The tour guides took their guests accros ski trails which cover over 220 hectares and measure all in all 85 kilometres in their length. In addition to circular cable car track the skiers can reach the top of ski trails with the help of three chair lifts and twelve ski lifts.

Ski School Pohorje - Ski Club Branik is the biggest ski school in Slovenia which

employs 160 active ski instructors who train 1500 participants a year, from preschool children to adults, among which many are hotel guests. In the school of alpine skiing every year more than 270 ski trails are included in the ski programme. The Ski School Pohorje gave birth to numerous out-

Slovenia into EU


Dr. Rado Generio, Secretary of State in the Ministry for European Affairs, explained on yesterday's round table discussion the major objectives of Slovenia in its integration into the European Union.

He predicted that Slovenia will be able to meet the majority of the requirements for the membership in the Union in 2002, however, full membership status will be probably ac-

quired later after this date. This depends on the political decision of the EU Member States. Compared to other candidates for the membership, Slovenia fulfills the conditions in the greatest measure, this is first of all due to the fact that since the fall of the Berlin wall Slovenia has spread its economic, political and cultural links with the western Europe, especially with Italy and Austria. According to the opinion of dr. Generio, Slovenia is one of the most serious candidates for the entry into EU, also from the viewpoint of the reform of the economic administration and of the adjustment to the European legislation. In the last two years a great progress has been made in Slovenia in this field, what was confirmed also by the European Commission in its November report in last year.



Tomorrow, on Wednesday, you will be able to see three hot air balloons which will lift you - if, of course, the weather will allow - from the ground. Therefore, gather around the ballon baskets and venture your one-hour flight (you can apply with Lidija Kosi; the flight costs 1.500 Sit per person). During lunch at the occasion of "Prlekija-Prekmurje Day" we will be entertained by a band of tambura players from Ljutomer, pensioners, united by music, good will and songs from Prlekija.



More than 25 participants, who asked very open and direct questions, took part in the last night's discussion. Our Norvegian colleague, for example, wanted to know why does Slovenia want to enter EU for any cost when it is already economically as well as politically very successful. Dr. Generio drew our attention to the fact that Slovenia is a small market and as such it needs the European market. After completing the round-table discussion, the participants developed informal dialogue on the possibilities of integration into EU the prevailing opinion was that Slovenia will integrate successfully.

No war

Yesterday some of our colleagues anxiously looked towards the eastern part of the forest where a real cannonade was set up. Don't worry, there is no war going on, and no putsch in Maribor - the soldiers had their shooting practice on the field behind the forest. One could nearly call it a peaceful one.

Preparation for the fight

Less peaceful were, however, the preparations of our colleagues on the tomorrow's encounter on the white battlefield; serviceman in the wardrobe namely received so many skis for varnishing and sharpening that he had to work late into the night!



Olympic Katja today

Today a selected row of demonstrators presented skis from Elan ski factory, one of the best produc-

ers of skis in the world. Among them there was also **Katja Koren**, the former ski representative of Slovenia, winner of giant slalom olympic medal in Lillehammer in 1994.

She holds one golden, four silver and one bronze medal in the World Cup championship. Katja gave up racing two seasons ago; her first ski turns were made at this very place, on Pohorje, which is in a direct vicinity of her family house. She holds this winter stadium in her fondest remembrance because it was here that she stepped on the highest step as a winner of the World Cup championship.

"Golden Fox of Maribor is the World Cup race which all women skiers are really looking forward to. I love Pohorje very much, although I never go there to ski just for fun or recreation. Perhaps I'll

do that later when skiing will not be my profession anymore", says Katja. At the moment she's a

demonstrator for Elan, what she likes very much because in this way she can keep in touch with skiing and be constantly well-informed about the novelties of the ski scene. But the hard and straining times, when she was still racing as a representative, are over for her now.

"I don't miss that stressful and straning life-style in the arena of sport. But it would be very hard for me to leave all this at once."

We were expecting to see Bojan Križaj among the today's demonstrators, but unfortunately bad luck with his car prevented him from coming. Nev-

ertheless, the legend of the Slovene and world skiing will be in our midst tomorrow as one of the pre-skiers on the giant slalom race.

The happy couple is (as far as we know) the first permanent SCU couple and we sincerely hope not the last one.


Slow food and fast printing

They were very worried because they thought that our border was closed during the night, however, their fear turned soon into great satisfaction when the Austrian and our customs officers just friendly waved at them.



Still some free places!



Bograč from Prekmurje

Wednesday was reserved for a Prekmurje lad-(Cap) and Priekija girls (Lidija, Tatjana). They are the members of "Slovene tribes", inhabiting the outer region of northeastern Slovenia.

You had the opportunity to know them from the culinary as well as from the wine side. Culinary art was in the hands of Branko Časar, chef in the Hotel Diana in Murska Sobota, and wine was pourred by winegrowers from Kapela and Radgonske gorice.

A delicious "bograč", traditional dish typical for Prekmurje region was served at lunch. It is, in fact, a Hungarian shepherd's dish (with beef), which was adapted by Prekmurje folk a century or two ago. "Bograč" has to contain three sorts of meat (beef, pork, game - preferably venison), potatoes and a whole bunch of spices. Indespensable ingredient is white and red wine. And it has to be very spicy (we spared you this part), so chilly pepper is recommended.

In the evening another culinary surprise was served: "koline" (pork and sausage) from Prekmurje, "bujta repa" (turnip), millet and buckwheat black pudding, and of course wine filled with sunshine.



Business operations with Slovenia are not risky

Representatives of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Slovenia prepared an interesting round-table discussion about the economic situation of Slovenia. The President of the Chamber, Jožko Čuk, said that the integration of Slovenia into the European Union is not the question of economy but politics. According to his opinion our integration into EU won't be too demanding, mostly due to the fact that Slovenia operated till now already in a way the Europe does. "Whoever makes business with Slovenia, runs at no risk whatsoever, because the customs and conditions of this country are pretty much the same as in more developed European countries," is convinced Čuk, Italy and Austria, already members of the Union, are not only Slovenia's neighbours, they are also strongly connected with Slovenia

from the viewpoint of history.

At the moment Slovena has to deal with the question of how to provide enough capable managers for the industry and economy which are still in the process of growth. Here the Chamber proved to be of great help with organizing education seminars on international and state level. The participants of the round table were among other issues interested also in the process of privatization in Slovenia, in the position of authorized companies, stock exchange, etc. After entering into EU, Slovenia will have to posess enough knowledge of Croatian, Bosnian and Herzegovinian market, because they are Slovenia's largest business partners, and in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Slovenia is presently the biggest financial investor.

Journalism after the fall of the Berlin wall

On the round-table discussion about journalism after the fall of the Berlin wall, media from four countries - Bolgaria, Russian Federation, Poland and Slovenia - presented the present situation. All reporters could agree on one point, namely that the number of media, above all of commercial radio and TV stations, and magazines, strongly increased after the year 1990, whereas the number of daily papers remained everywhere about the same as before the mentioned year,

Democracy, which gradually started to penytrate the media, brought together with greater freedom of speech also some negative sides. In Bolgaria, for example, the foreign investment capital started pouring in, and took over around 80% of all media, not to mention the position of the Bolgarian journalists which is not exactly toscate. The employ es receive neither collective nor labour con-


tracts, from puppets of the politics they have turned into puppets of the capital. While in Slovene media foreign capital plays no major role (with exception of the commercial televisions), are the Russian media in the hands of large domestic companies and private persons. The share of foreign capital in the Polish media is considerable, however, it is split in a way that the journalists are not under so great pressure from the side of the owner.

Straight down, 1,100 meters of nothing down, was the military shooting range you have all heard.



II. To forbid the use of skating skis during the crosscountry race. The reason for this is because this is a classical style race. The use of this type of skis is absolutely forbidden in the FIS sky rules.

Newcomers to the club discover the bizarre rules of SCIJ.



Weather forecast



The General Assembly

On the General Assembly, where we dedicated a minute of silence to the memory of the deceased Michele Leburn Meier (died at 32), the president of SCIJ, Beppe Errani, thanked, prior to the discussion on the topical subjects, for the excellent organization of this year's meeting, which is, according to him, so good that one simply cannot find a thing that could be criticized.

After that he reminded us that there is still no official candidate for the organization of the SCIJ Winter Meeting in 2002 and 2003, however, the meeting at the occasion of the 50th Jubilee will take place sooner, e.i. instead of in the beginning of the year 2004, we shall gather already in the December 2003 in Courchevel.

We spent a lot of time on the discussion about supplying enough financial support for the publication of SCIJ News, and on the question whether we should still keep the printed form of this magazine after it will be issued on the Internet (in three to four years' time). The decision was reached that the membership fee be raised by 10 ChF, and that SCIJ News reach Internet as soon as possible.

Among the most important news of the Assembly, relevant above all for the future organizers, was the recommendation for the countries which normally cannot organize such meetings (due to objective reasons), to cooperate with the organizers by sponsoring a dinner for example.

Because at the occasion of the 50° Jubilee a special book will be published, which will reflect the history of our meetings and to which everyone can give a contribution, all SCD members are invited to cooperate. It is therefore recommended to all of us to search through the memories and recollections, photo records, etc. – and send the contributions by latest September this year, when the SCD Summer Meeting in Belgium (Spa) will take place, to the vice-presidents of SCD.

On the meeting in Maribor the statistics of participation, prepared by Peter Daadler, showed that the number of women in the teams of particular countries has slightly risen; age structure improved a bit, but it is still far from the satisfactory—the Statute of SCIJ namely states that the women should be represented by at least a third in each team, and that more than a half of the participants should be under 45. Maribor recieved 36% of women journalists and 45% of participants under 45, the age limit fixed by SCIJ Statute. Moreover, there are many participating countries which do not fulfil the agreement about contributions to the Press Book.

The Assembly ended with a renewed candidacy of Kopaonik for the site of the SCIJ World Meeting in 2003.








Parting - but not for long

The basin at river Savinja was inhabited by the Old Romans already at the beginning of our century, the evidence of which are numerous findings and excavations in this area. Celje reached its historical peak in the middle of the second millenuim with the rise of the noble family of the Counts of Celeia, who in that time succesfully entered and influenced political circles of Europe. The remains of their fortress above the city became today a symbol of Celje. Their rise and fall is illustrated in the exhibition. of the Provincial Museum of Celje, which was today visited also by our SCIJ participants. They were very pleased with what they saw. Those among you, however, who missed this chance, will perhaps get another opportunity somewhere in Europe, for this outstanding exhibiton will soon tour in many European museums. The exhibition will be open in Celie till the end of May.

Well I figured everyone's gotta get acquainted somehow. May as well be this way.




